

In this period, DCA-VET started the distribution of vaccines to the veterinary field units, funded by the EU. The organisation also built its second Afghan training centre in Charikar.

As the frontline of the advancing Taliban was located nearby, the training activities then had to move to Kabul. Notwithstanding the Taliban rule over the country from 1995 to 2001, DCA-VET managed to operate two training centres, and to gradually expand its VFU program. Tragically, DCA-VET lost its Afghan Project Manager, Dr. Sayed Naqibullah, being abducted by the Taliban in 1999.



After the defeat of the Taliban in 2002, DCA-VET moved its main office from Peshawar to Kabul (becoming the National Headquarters).
